FOOTPATH ALONGSIDE THE ARTLEBECK FROM BROOKHOUSE ROAD TO HORNBY ROAD - Lancashire County Council is responsible for reinstating this footpath. Both the Parish Council and the Peak and Northern Footpath Society have asked them to act. However the work will be very expensive. It seems it will need more pressure from local residents to get action from LCC on the footpath. If you want to see this footpath restored, please contact The Lancashire County Council Public Rights of Way team by email on PROW@lancashire.gov.uk, or telephone 01772 530317. The reference number for the footpath is FP14 in Caton-with-Littledale. It would be helpful if you could let the Parish Clerk have a copy of your letter or email, or information about your phonecall.

CATON GALA

When, due to circumstances, we were forced to cancel Caton Gala 2020 we were all confident that we would bounce back in 2021.

That was 12 months ago, since then the situation has changed on innumerable occasions. This has meant that there have been many changes to government rules and guidance. We have been carefully monitoring these.

Even before Christmas, we were still fairly hopeful that we would be able to hold Caton Gala 2021. You will all be aware that in January the government introduced yet another "lockdown". The legislation imposing these restrictions did not set out much in terms of providing the opportunity to plan for a recovery. We have now had the "roadmap out of lockdown". This provides certain dates concluding with a proposal to end restrictions by the 21st of June 2021. It is clear from the actual wording that the dates put forward are "earliest possible" dates and restrictions may continue far beyond these.

We are mindful that individuals and businesses need to "plan ahead". We have had a number of discussions and are not prepared to promote and prepare for an event that we may not be able to lawfully deliver. We have therefore taken the decision that we will not hold Caton Gala 2021. We will reconvene in the autumn with a view to carrying on the tradition of Caton Gala into 2022. We thank you for your understanding and hope that you will be aware that circumstances are totally beyond our control.



CROOK O'LUNE BEAUTY SPOT GETS NEW LEASE OF LIFE AS A WILDFLOWER MEADOW

A beauty spot at the Crook O'Lune near Lancaster, known locally as Hermitage Field, is getting a new lease of life as a wildflower meadow.

A formal 12 year license agreement has been finalised between Lancaster City Council as owner of the site and charitable residents' group, Hermitage Field Community Meadow. The agreement will allow the group to manage a five acre plot of land in the field on the council's behalf as a wildflower meadow.

Hermitage Field already contributes to the area being a popular place to visit, with car park and picnic facilities nearby, as well as stunning views across the Lune Valley. The remaining two acres at the centre of the field is already being managed under a separate licence by charity 'Life for a Life', as a memorial forest.

The Hermitage Field Community Meadow charity was recently set up by a group of local residents and has already acquired funding to help them create and manage the meadow. Work has begun on preparing the land before new planting can take place later in the year. The aim of the project is to develop an attractive and enhanced landscape at the popular site which will complement the new memorial forest.

The paths running through the site and parallel with the road will be retained and maintained to enable visitors to the Crook O'Lune to enjoy access to the field.

Councillor Kevin Frea, Cabinet member for climate action and member of Crook O'Lune Advisory Committee, said: "The creation and development of a wildflower meadow at Hermitage Field by local people that are passionate about the conservation of this special place, has provided the council with another perfect opportunity to breathe new life into this treasured beauty spot.

"As well as looking incredibly attractive and complementing the natural beauty of the memorial forest on the same site, the new arrangement will also have massive ecological benefits. Introducing pollinating plants and enticing pollinating bees, insects and other wildlife to the site will increase biodiversity as well provide a local seed bank for other potential meadows.'

"The arrangement also supports the aims of the council's new grassland management strategy which will see changes to the way grass is cut in local parks and public spaces, again to help increase biodiversity and meet the council's climate change commitments.

The initiative was spearheaded by local resident and trustee of the charity, Erica Sarney who initially set up a group called the Community Pollinator Patches and went on to form the charity with a number of like-minded friends.

Erica said: "We're very much looking forward to getting this exciting project off the ground and creating a stunning meadow teeming with wildflowers and wildlife for everyone to enjoy. Local people love this area so much and which is also part of a popular ramble overlooking the Lune Valley towards Ingleborough.

"We really hope everyone enjoys the meadow and may be inspired to come and join us, when restrictions allow, to help us bring it to life. For more information and how you can get involved, visit our website at www.hermitagefieldcommunitymeadow.com"

The charity has secured funding from Plantlife, The Areti Charitable Trust, Halton Lune Hydro Trust, Forest of Bowland AONB and Life for a Life Memorial Forests. Part of the site has already been sown with seed from Lancashire's Coronation Meadow at Bell Sykes Farm, Forest of Bowland AONB, as well as Gait Barrows Reserve in Silverdale.

The project will be growing wildflowers with volunteers in polytunnels at the council's White Lund Depot in Morecambe.

THE ROTARY CLUB OF LUNESDALE

On 25th February the club was privileged to have a speaker from the lesser known part of the medical profession. Members welcomed Kadaba Srinath Vasuden who likes to be called simply Vas. He is a member of the Rotary Club of Blackpool Palatine. It was a surprise to hear, early on in his talk, that as a one year old toddler he had been the victim of polio. It was learning about the global Rotary commitment to rid the world of polio that attracted him to become a Rotarian himself. He gave a fascinating talk about his work and that of his colleagues referring to himself and them as The Backroom Boys. His subject is Histopathology which is the diagnosis and study of diseases of the body's tissues. This involves examining under a microscope tissues and or cells. The results of such detailed examination help clinicians to manage a patient's care. Vas explained that the common concept of a pathologist is a person who examines dead bodies. He emphasised however that the examination under a microscope of tissues and cells is a vital process which assists in determining the cause of problems very much in the living! On March 4th Stephen Hinde, a retired police officer, also gave an excellent talk. He spoke about his career in the force and his involvement in solving the cases of 3 murders. On 11th March Graham Jackson gave an extremely interesting talk about the history of legal dress. He spoke about the use of vibrant colours of the robes worn by the judiciary eg scarlet, gold and blue, the materials used including silks, taffeta, and white fur plus an explanation about the different types of wigs worn.
