WAR MEMORIAL RAILINGS - At the start of January, a celebration banner was hung on the railings at the War Memorial. On 2 January it was taken down. Removing the banner was not done by the Parish Council or by parish councillors. It is sad that the ladies who should have been celebrating a birthday were distressed by this.

However, this is perhaps a good time to ask people not to put banners or adverts on the railings. Two main reasons. First, a proliferation of banners and adverts could be seen as disrespectful to the War Memorial and those commemorated on it. Second, there are concerns about reducing visibility on the roundabout and its approaches. But is there a good alternative space for banners and adverts? Could one be provided somewhere in the centre of the village? If you have ideas please let the Parish Clerk or one of the councillors know.

GRITTING AND GRIT BINS - The January meeting of the Parish Council heard complaints about lack of gritting in the village, especially on Moorside Road. We are asking Lancashire Highways whether our roads could be treated more often. Also, there are grit bins in some places in the village, often near slopes or bends. Where do we need more? And do the existing grit bins need filling? Let the Clerk know - please be as precise about locations, and include a photo if you can.

ROAD SAFETY - Lancashire Highways is doing the detailed planning for safety measures on the A683 through the village and up the Lune Valley. The installation of average speed cameras is part of the package, covering the stretch from Junction 34 to Kirkby Lonsdale. Work is expected near Holme Lane and the Bull Beck car park to improve road safety.

LITTER BINS - The Parish Council is complaining to Lancaster City Council about overflowing litter bins and dog waste bins on the roads and along the Millennium Way over Christmas and New Year. It certainly made the work of the litter-pickers on 2 January even more vital than ever!

ASH DIEBACK AT BECKSIDE - The Parish Council is still getting opinions on what needs to be done/ If trees are removed, new native trees will be planted.

NEW COUNCILLOR: We are pleased to report that Mike Wright has been co-opted onto the Parish Council. Mike lives at Escowbeck.



B4RN HYPERFAST BROADBAND

This month we have a call to everyone in Caton and Brookhouse who thinks they may need B4RN now or in the future to register an interest NOW.

CATON NEWS

As we start the new year, B4RN head office are putting the final touches to the plan for Caton. Good progress is being made by the contractors in Halton, with us being next on the list! However, out of the 800 properties listed for Caton, only 200 have signed up for a connection. Before B4RN will commit to roll out we would need at least 100 more. Have you signed the form on the GETB4RN page at b4rn.org.uk/getb4rn ?? (Search "GETB4RN" in a web browser). Have you persuaded friends/neighbours/family in the village to sign up??

Shares invested in B4RN can also offset the numbers of sign up needed. With B4RN still paying 5% interest on all shares (minimum holding $\pounds 100/max \pounds 100,000$, shares must be kept in for three years) it is a great investment and helps get the infrastructure built .

BROOKHOUSE NEWS

For a number of years we have struggled to get parts of the village connected as many properties are in a more compact or densely populated 'urban' design to many surrounding rural hamlets and single properties.

We have a small window to access government funding to plan to dig up the pavements and provide a connection point in the pavement to all those properties.

We need you to register NOW so by end of February B4RN can determine if there is enough interest to do this.

Please remember that this means your property could then have a B4RN connection ready for you just outside your front garden.

Please be aware that every person who has moved into the village has taken a B4RN connection, it's a huge selling point. Also with so many people working from home and with home learning we all need the best access for our work and family so having access to future proof internet services is critical.

But progress in peat reduction is slow mainly, as we all know, because of the difficulties in finding alternatives. The competition for wood fibre for instance is fierce because it is also a fuel for biomass.

However, this has not stopped the National Trust, RHS, RSPB, Friends of the Earth and others like Monty Don asking the government for a total ban on peat import and extraction from 2025. Lets see what happens. And do support our local Wildlife Trust if you can in its efforts to reclaim the lost mosses of the north west.
