PARISH COUNCIL

PRECEPT - The Parish Precept is the amount of your council tax which is paid to the Parish Council. At present (21/22) for a house in Band D this is £31.65 a year. Last year the Parish Council made no increase in the Parish Precept, but this coming year (22/23) it has to increase by 3%. The largest item of expenditure is support for the Victoria Institute. Then there are the wages of the Parish Clerk, the maintenance of the Play Park, the War Memorial, the two village car parks, grass cutting and the upkeep of benches and bus shelters in the village. The Parish Council also pays for the village website and the Christmas tree. Insurance is a big item. If you would like to know more about the work of the Parish Council do contact the Parish Clerk or one of the councillors, who are all volunteers who live in the parish or close by.

HEDGES - Another reminder of the need to cut back hedges, trees and bushes to keep footpaths and roads. In extreme cases Lancashire Highways may do the work and then charge the landowner. Do tell the Parish Clerk of any trees, bushes or hedges obstructing pavements and roads. Please give her exact addresses - the name of the householder isn't needed.

WORK ON THE A683 AT BULL BECK - The accident black spot just east of the Bull Beck Car Park has been flagged to Lancashire Highways repeatedly. They do plan improvements including proper crash barriers on the bend (like the ones at Crook o'Lune) but are having some difficulties with the bridge in that area and some BT cabling. Highways hope to get the work done in the first half of 2022.

MILLENNIUM WAY - Lancashire County Council is responsible for maintenance on the Millennium Way. They plan to improve the lighting on the Millennium Way, including cleaning, repairs and new LED bulbs. NEW COUNCILLORS NEEDED - At present we have just nine councillors; there is space for three new councillors. If you would like to find out more, please speak to one of the existing councillors or ask the Parish Clerk.
